

**UNANIMOUS CONSENT TO ACTION
BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The undersigned, constituting all of the members of the Board of Directors of Sun City Festival Community Association, Inc., an Arizona nonprofit corporation, hereby take the following actions in writing and without a meeting pursuant to Section 10-3821, Arizona Revised Statutes, which actions shall have the same force and effect as if taken by the Board at a duly called meeting of the Board.

RESOLVED, that Sun City Festival Rules and Regulations, dated July 28, 2009, is hereby amended to add the following paragraph on page 13, directly under the paragraph titled "Trash/Recycling Containers and Collection":

WEAPONS POLICY: Weapons are prohibited in all buildings and on all common areas owned by Sun City Festival Community Association, Inc.

Prohibited weapons include the following:


1. **Deadly weapons:** Anything that is designed for lethal use. The term includes a firearm.
2. **Firearms:** Any loaded or unloaded handgun, pistol, revolver, rifle, shotgun or other weapons that will expel, is designed to expel or may readily be converted to expel a projective by the action of an explosive. Firearm does not include a firearm in permanently inoperable condition.
3. **Explosives:** Any dynamite, nitroglycerine, black powder, or other similar explosive material, including plastic explosives. Explosive does not include ammunition or ammunition components such as primers, percussion caps, smokeless powder, black powder and black powder substitutes used for hand loading purpose.
4. An item that is a bomb, grenade, or rocket that has a propellant charge of more than four ounces and is an explosive, incendiary or poison gas.
5. A device that is designed, made or adapted to muffle the report of a firearm.
6. A firearm that is capable of shooting more than one shot automatically, without manual reloading, by a single function of the trigger.
7. A rifle with a barrel length of less than sixteen inches, or shotgun with a barrel length of less than eighteen inches, or any firearm that is made from a rifle or shotgun and that, as modified, has an overall length of less than twenty-six inches.

8. An instrument, including a nunchaku, that consists of two or more sticks, clubs, bars or rods to be used as handles, connected by a rope, cord, wire or chain, in the design of a weapon used in connection with the practice of a system of self-defense.
9. A breakable container that contains a flammable liquid with a flash point of one hundred fifty degrees Fahrenheit or less and that has a wick or similar device capable of being ignited.
10. A chemical or combination of chemicals, compounds or materials, including dry ice, that is possessed or manufactured for the purpose of generating a gas to cause a mechanical failure, rupture or bursting or an explosion or detonation of the chemical or combination of chemicals, compounds or materials.
11. An improvised explosive device.
12. Any combination of parts or materials that is designed and intended for use in making or converting a device into an item set forth in item 1, 6 or 8 of this paragraph.

Prohibited weapons do not include the following:

1. Any fireworks that are imported, distributed or used in compliance with state laws or local ordinances.
2. Any propellant, propellant actuated devices or propellant actuated industrial tools that are manufactured, imported or distributed for their intended purposes.
3. A device that is commercially manufactured primarily for the purpose of illumination.
4. Devices used as part of an approved martial arts class taking place on Sun City Festival Community Association property.
